Time to Reflect

I recently asked a few people whether we ought to become the sort of Church in which the word "evangelism" is part of our character, our DNA. I heard a variety of reactions, ranging from the 'when do we start?', through 'how do we start?' to 'that's not something we do'. Fairly typical responses.

We know in our hearts that we should be enthusiasts for telling people about God. We know in our heads that if we don't we should not expect others to. We know we cannot franchise out that responsibility to others. If we know if we don't evangelise, the Church will cease to be at some point. We point to the second response 'How do we start?' and are puzzled.

There is a clue in our first reading. Much of the reading is about a very particular pastoral issue. Essentially, it appears that some of this congregation are relying on others to pull their weight. The writer says forcefully that each of us must play our fair part. That is true of church today. But the writer says something else. He writes 'imitate me'.

And maybe this is the clue that should calm our anxieties about the "E" word? Our investment in our faith, not the knowledge stuff, the life bits, the practices of love, forgiveness, generosity, reconciliation, patience, and so on are the foundation from which we can build. And, from these foundations, we can say 'I am who I am and do what I do because of my faith in Christ'. Learning to add the last two words is the challenging bit. Try it!

The Collect


Heavenly Lord, you long for the world's salvation: stir us from apathy, restrain us from excess and revive in us new hope that all creation will one day be healed in Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

A reading from the second letter of Paul to the

Thessalonians (2 Thessalonians 3.6-13) Now we command you, beloved, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, to keep away from believers who are living in idleness and not according to the tradition that they received from us. For you yourselves know how you ought to imitate us; we were not idle when we were with you, and we did not eat anyone's bread without paying for it; but with toil and labour we worked night and day, so that we might not burden any of you. This was not because we do not have that right, but in order to give you an example to imitate. For even when we were with you, we gave you this command: Anyone unwilling to work should not eat. For we hear that some of you are living in idleness, mere busybodies, not doing any work. Now such persons we command and exhort in the Lord Jesus Christ to do their work quietly and to earn their own living. Brothers and sisters, do not be weary in doing what is right. This is the word of the Lord Thanks be to God

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke (Luke 21.5-19) Glory to you, O Lord When some were speaking about the temple, how it was adorned with beautiful stones and gifts dedicated to God, Jesus said, "As for these things that you see, the days will come when not one stone will be left upon another; all will be thrown down." They asked him, "Teacher, when will this be, and what will be the sign that this is about to take

place?" And he said, "Beware that you are not led astray; for many will come in my name and say, 'I am he!' and, 'The time is near!' Do not go after them. When you hear of wars and insurrections, do not be terrified:



for these things must take place first, but the end will not follow immediately." Then he said to them, "Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom; there will be great earthquakes, and in various places famines and plagues; and there will be dreadful portents and great signs from heaven. But before all this occurs, they will arrest you and persecute you; they will hand you over to synagogues and prisons, and you will be brought before kings and governors because of my name. This will give you an opportunity to testify. So make up your minds not to prepare your defence in advance; for I will give you words and a wisdom that none of your opponents will be able to withstand or contradict. You will be betrayed even by parents and brothers, by relatives and friends; and they will put

some of you to death. You will be hated by all because of my name. But not a hair of your head will perish. By your endurance you will gain your souls." *This is the Gospel of the Lord*
