Time to Reflect

Christ the King. A new "Feast" (1925), marking the end of the liturgical year. It is a reminder of why we come to church. And yet for most of us, trying to pin down what we think about Jesus is hard.

So, step forward today's reading from Colossians. Here, in this dense passage, are beautifully crafted phrases that neatly encapsulate thoughts about Christ. Listen up.....

(Jesus) *is the image of the invisible God.* To think of Jesus is to think of God. That's why we focus on him.

We have redemption, the forgiveness of sins....through the blood of his cross. Jesus is the source of reconciling God and us.

(Jesus) *is the head of the body, the church*. The church is the community in which Christ dwells.

God. My messy life. Church. Here are three possible entry points for a conversation with anyone as to why we come to Church. We could talk about God approaching us in a way we can understand or the experience of being loved and forgiven or the sense that Church is far more than an organisation.

We could talk. Therein is the challenge. Or possibly, the invitation. The writer of Colossians is blown away by Christ and, in this majestic, poetic, passage, sings with joy about what life is like 'in Christ'. I wonder whether we, too, might find our own words to speak of Christ or whether, equally appropriately, we might draw on this dramatic passage to share the Good News that Christ is King of our lives?

A reading from the letter of Paul to the Colossians (Colossians 1.11-20)

May you be made strong with all the strength that comes from his glorious power, and may you be prepared to endure everything with patience, while joyfully giving thanks to the Father, who has enabled you to share in the inheritance of the saints in the light. He has rescued us from the power of darkness and transferred us into the kingdom of his beloved Son, in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins. He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation; for in him all things in heaven and on earth were created, things visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or powers - all things have been created through him and for him. He himself is before all things, and in him all things hold together. He is the head of the body, the church; he is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, so that he might come to have first place in everything. For in him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, and through him God was pleased to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, by making peace through the blood of his cross.

When they came to the place that is called The Skull, they crucified Jesus there with the criminals, one on his right and one on his left. And the people stood by, watching; but the leaders scoffed at him, saying, "He saved others; let him save himself if he is the Messiah of God, his chosen one!" The soldiers also mocked him, coming

who were hanged there kept deriding him and saying, "Are you not the Messiah? Save yourself and us!" But the other rebuked him, saying, "Do you not fear God, since you are under the same sentence of condemnation? And we indeed have been condemned justly, for we are getting what we deserve for our deeds, but this man has done nothing wrong." Then he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." He replied, "Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in Paradise."
