Situated on top of the small hill at the centre of the town, Bury Parish Church stands at the heart of one of the ancient parishes of Lancashire. The present splendid building was opened for worship on 2nd February, the Feast of the Presentation, in 1876, and is certainly the third - possibly the fourth on the site. It is impossible now to know just when Christian worship began here, a thousand or so years ago.

During its long history, the Church has ministered to the town in many different ways. Bury Grammar School began life here in the Sixteenth Century, boys almost certainly being taught originally by clergy from the Parish Church. Parish Charities were set up to provide for the poor and sick.

The Rector was heavily involved in the growth of the town during the Industrial Revolution: much of the urban growth of those days took place on his glebe land. Sir Robert Peel, future Prime Minister and son of a local textile manufacturer, was baptized here in 1788. All of the dozen or so Anglican parishes in Bury were carved out of the original parish. The Church has had close links with the Lancashire Fusiliers (now part of the Royal Regiment of Fusiliers) since 1873 and continues to be a focus for the whole civic life of the Borough.

Today, we seek to continue to offer a wide variety of activities and opportunities to the whole town which we are called to serve for Jesus Christ's sake. This magazine gives its reader a snapshot, in one particular month, of what is on offer. We are always eager to find new ways of witness and service and should be glad to receive any constructive suggestions.


#### MU Cookbook lands!

### The Children's Society News:

The last five months have been a difficult time for many people, having to get used to a change in lifestyle and restrictions affecting contact with family and friends, resulting in an increase in anxiety and insecurity for young and old alike.

The "Lockdown" and closure of schools was even more disturbing for the young people being supported by The Children's Society, especially those youngsters whose home environment was often the scene of abuse and family conflict. The restrictions caused by the pandemic forced these youngsters to live in fear with the perpetrator being constantly present at home. TCS project workers had to find new, often covert ways of providing the much needed, support throughout this extremely trying time, working with police, social care and health professionals. Lessons have been learned from such experiences and strategies developed to ensure the continuous safety of these vulnerable young people.

Like almost every other charity, The Children's Society has suffered from the pandemic through the cancellation of fundraising events and appeals, resulting in a greater need for local groups such as our own Bury Parish Church Home Box Collection Group. The financial support from this group and the fundraising efforts of our uniformed organisations form the backbone of our Community Mission, bringing hope to vulnerable children in Bury and the wider scope of Greater Manchester. In the current climate we cannot rely on traditional forms of support, The Annual Christingle Service for example is already the subject of discussion in an attempt to find

a way forward for congregations to participate in what has become one of the "must do" traditions of Christmas. I remember attending my first your Christingle Service at Bury Parish Church in 1972 with my class of forty-nine, eleven, year olds from Christ Church School, Walshaw, and have made Christingles every year since. It certainly is a "must do" event to be enjoyed in whatever format we can safely organise.

New members of the Home Box Group are always welcome, if you can help, or would like further information please give me a ring on 0161 797 4488.

For current group members our next Home Box collection will be during Advent, further details regarding how to safely return the boxes and collect your new box will be forwarded nearer the date.



### **Bury Parish Church Walking Group**

## Churches St Peter's Church Salesbury.



The first chapel was built here in1806 and consecrated 8<sup>th</sup> September 1807 by the Lord Bishop of Chester. The money was raised by landowner because of the boom in weaving. The chapel had one rectangular room with a Porch Chimney and Bell. In 1873 new Vicar Reverend Peter Hopwood Hart set up a committee to raise money for a new church. It was built in the

same position as the old chapel. The church was built in the 14<sup>th</sup> century Gothic Style. Consecrated on 29 June 1887 was also known as the Jubilee Church because it was the year of Queen Victoria's Golden Jubilee.

### St Andrew's Slaidburn.



Constructed in sandstone with a stone slate roof. It dates back to the 15<sup>th</sup> century. The interior has some interesting fetchers, some box pews, and a three decked pulpit.



There is also a Rood screen dating from about 1630's. There is a ring of six bells, all cast in the Whitechapel Bell Foundry, five in 1843 and one in 1927.

All Hallows Great Mitton formerly St Michael.



Sometimes Mitton is spelt with a Y. Historical record states there has been a church on this site as early as 1102. There was a rebuild in 1270's by the de Mittons. The Shireburnes of Stonyhurst (these names have a few different spelling), had the North side chapel rebuilt as a family mausoleum. As with many churches there was parts added or altered. The clock was made by Messrs W Protts & Son of Leeds it made its first strike to bring in the New Year of 1898 witnessed by many of the congregation.
